

20.8 million people in the US are living with an ambulatory disability†




1 in 3 older adults in Indiana with household income below \$25k annually report mobility needs*

Quality of Life


Clients are asked "How fearful are you of exiting your home in the event of an emergency?" A SAWs ramp has a profound effect on our clients' quality of life and personal safety.
