### **From the Executive Director**



**Dear Friends,** 

**Good News!** SAWs is up and running for 2020 as we built our first four ramps during the week of May 18th. Congratulations to our Staff and Volunteers for making this restart a success. It couldn't come at a more critical time, as

our ramp backlog has now grown to over 350 clients and continues to increase. This comes after a record ramp building season during 2019 with over 347 ramps built in the State of Indiana, not counting our out of state Affiliates in Arizona and Virginia. The need to provide freedom, independence and dignity to clients trapped in their homes is more important than ever before.

It's not going to be an easy task for us to reduce the backlog due to the shortened build season from our normal 37 weeks down to 25 and the economic downturn which has impacted donations. These factors continue to cause headwinds to our fiscal budget and our planned strategy for 2020. We will not let this deter us! If you can donate or volunteer your time; your efforts will allow us to continue to move forward with our mission.

### **BuilderTrend**

We took the opportunity during the COVID-19 down time to implement a new project management solution called BuilderTrend. This program will allow us to streamline client processing, eliminate unnecessary steps that caused delays, and expedite the client application vetting process and ultimately fast track the entire SAWs process. This could not have been accomplished without the lead from our Board members Al Erickson and Aaron Johnson along with additional support and field training by Emily Barrow, Rafe Mount and Rik Hagarty from our Staff. Their tremendous effort enabled this conversion to be completed in less than 75 days and the benefits were measurable once we re-started and scheduled future builds.

### **Message from the Founder**

Time is the single most precious commodity known to man. It does not matter if we are rich or poor, intelligent or challenged, happy or sad, joyous or depressed. We all get the same number of hours every day. The past few months have given us all a much greater appreciation of time and how we use it.

Isolation for most of us is ending. However, the isolation experienced by low income people with disabilities will end only when SAWs builds their bridge to freedom...their wheelchair

ramp. While the safety of each of our volunteers and clients is our first priority, freeing people with disabilities from their isolation is our mission.

Donations, sponsorships, and grants are the lifeblood of the SAWs organization and we continue to need all we can get. If funding is the lifeblood, volunteers turn that blood into action. Four adults and two adolescents built the first ramp. Today, our ranks have swelled from that small group to hundreds throughout Indiana, Arizona, and Virginia. Last year our volunteers, through the support of our donors, restored 378 people to their families, friends, and communities.

The need keeps growing. We need more volunteers, more volunteer leadership, more donations to support the volunteers' efforts. There are thousands of people that are trapped in their homes by their disabilities waiting to be released from their isolation. Every one of us is given 24 hours each day. How will you spend yours? ### **SAWs 2019 Rearview Mirror**

A little over two years ago the SAWs Board of Directors implemented a Strategic plan. Two aspects of that plan were to:

- 1. Expand SAWs ramp building across the entire state of Indiana and
- 2. Capture the opportunity to establish affiliates beyond Indiana.

At the end of 2019, we observed early results indicating success in implementing that strategic plan. The following graphic illustrates the number of ramps built with our new "Hub and Spoke" format across the State during 2019 and with our two Affiliates that now build ramps in Virginia and Arizona.

### SAWs Ramp Build 2018 vs 2019
