Autumn is traditionally SAWs' busiest ramp building season. Many volunteers are back from vacations, kids and grandkids are back in school, and the weather is cooler. It is the perfect time to build a ramp!

We're incredibly grateful for the milestones we've achieved this year:

- Built our 4000th ramp in May
- Welcomed 10 new project managers to lead ramp builds
- Launched aluminum ramp installations for faster solutions
- Hosted our first-ever Ramp-a-thon, building 20+ ramps in one day and streaming it live on YouTube
- Partnered with 18 new corporations to expand our reach

I'm thrilled to announce that we've built 455 ramps so far this year, surpassing our 2024 goal of 430—and setting a record for SAWs! This achievement highlights the dedication of our incredible volunteers and supporters.

Looking ahead, there's still important work to be done:

- Our waitlist continues to grow, and we need ongoing support to serve more individuals.
- We're expanding our project manager team and creating online training resources, including a construction manual for easy reference.

SAWs has proudly completed its 4000th ramp for the Parry family in Pendleton, Indiana, built by Rehab Medical volunteers just days after our successful annual fundraiser. This ramp represents a significant step towards greater independence for Darlene Parry.

At the annual fundraiser at Plum Creek Golf Course, we raised \$55,223 to continue building ramps throughout Indiana.
